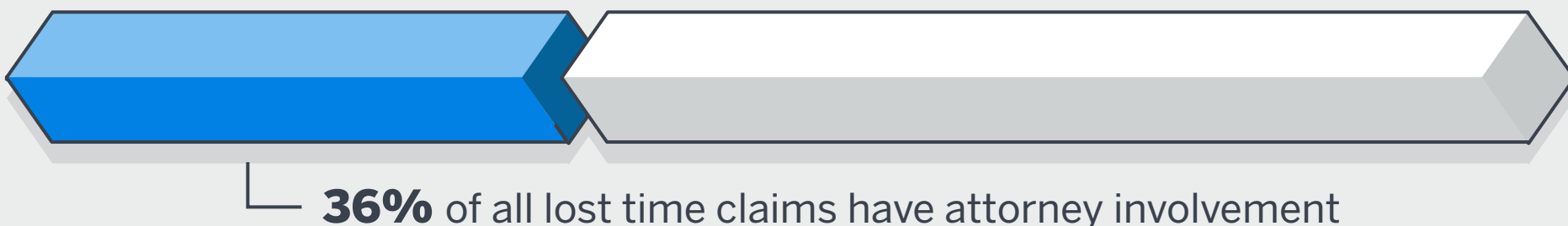


How does attorney involvement impact workers' compensation claims?

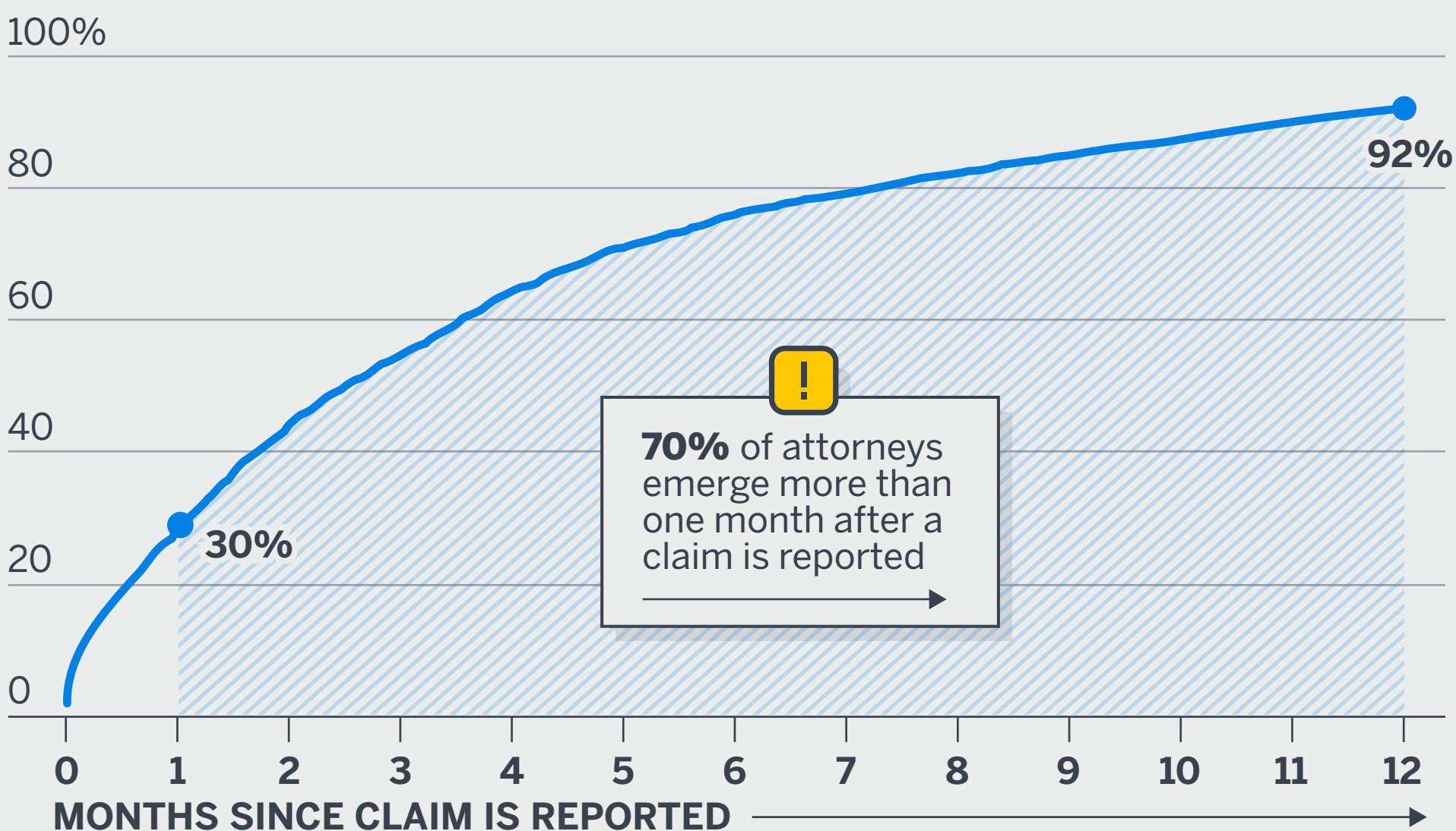

more than cases without an attorney



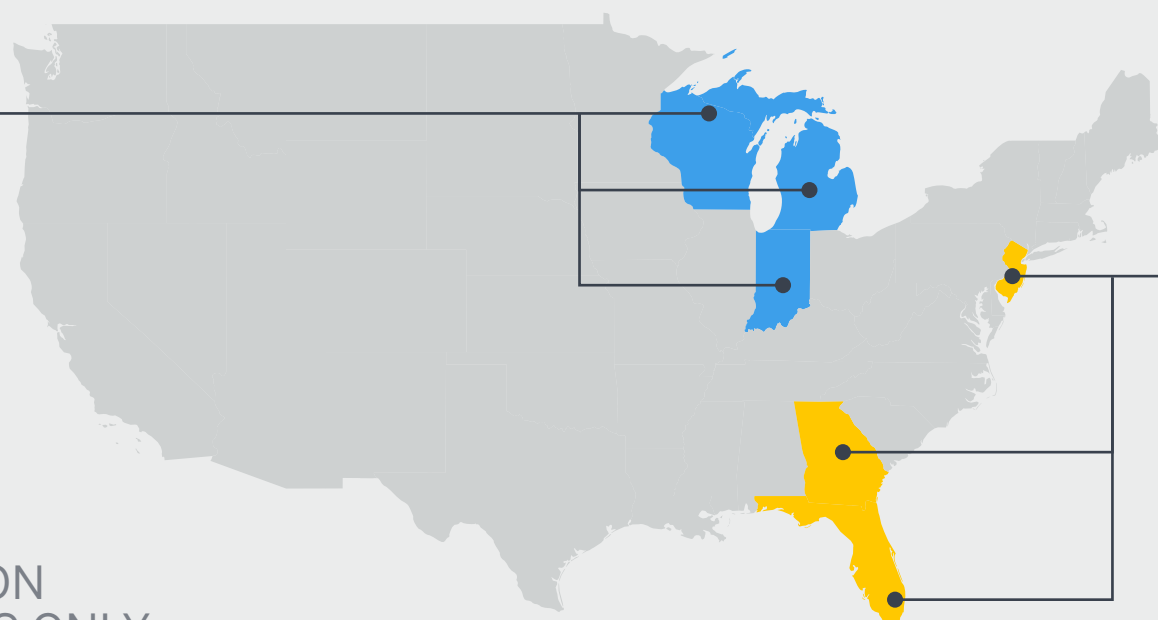
